# LMR51603 Evaluation Module



## **Description**

The LMR51603EVM is a fully assembled and tested circuit designed to help users easily evaluate and test the operation and functionality of the LMR51603 converter. This EVM operates typical 12V input, and provides a 5V output at 300mA. Integrated low  $R_{\mbox{\footnotesize{DS(ON)}}}$  power MOSFETs enable high efficiency and offer ease of use with a minimal external component count for space-constrained power systems.

#### 1 Evaluation Module Overview

#### 1.1 Introduction

The LMR51603 is a single, PCM control mode, synchronous buck converter requiring a very low external component count. This user's guide describes the characteristics, operation, performance, and use of the Texas Instruments' LMR51603 evaluation module (EVM). This user's guide includes the following:

The LMR51603 synchronous buck converter used in the EVM has the following features:

- Wide input voltage range: 5.5V 65V (absolute maximum = 70V)
- Fixed frequency with 1.1MHz
- Support 300mA continuous output current
- 26.5uA low quiescent current
- ±1.5% output voltage accuracy at 25°C
- 80ns minimum switching on time
- · Short-circuit protection with hiccup mode
- · Forced PWM and PFM options

## 1.3 Specification

A summary of the LMR51603EVM performance specifications is provided in Table 1-1. Specifications are given for 12V input voltage and 5V output voltage, unless otherwise noted. The ambient temperature is 25°C for all measurement, unless otherwise noted.




Figure 1-1. LMR51603 Synchronous Buck Regulator Simplified Schematic

The schematic of an LMR51603-based synchronous buck converter is shown in Figure 1-1.

#### 1.4 Device Information

The LMR51603 evaluation module (EVM) is a single, synchronous buck converter providing 5V at 300A from a 5.5V to 65V input.

## 2 Hardware

## 2.1 Test Setup and Procedure

#### 2.1.1 EVM Connections




Figure 2-1. EVM Test Setup

Referencing the EVM connections described in Table 2-1, the recommended test setup to evaluate the LMR51603 is shown in Figure 2-1. Working at an ESD-protected workstation, make sure that any wrist straps, boot straps, or mats are connected and referencing the user to earth ground before handling the EVM.

#### 2.1.2 Test Equipment

Voltage Source: Use an input voltage source capable of supplying 0V to 65V and 0.3A.

#### **Multimeters:**

- Voltmeter: Output voltage at VOUT to GND. Set the voltmeter to an input impedance of 100MΩ.
- Ammeter 1: Output current. Set the ammeter to 1-second aperture time.
- Ammeter 2: Input current. Set the ammeter to 1-second aperture time.

**Electronic Load:** The load must be an electronic constant-resistance (CR) or constant-current (CC) mode load capable of 0A to 0.3A. For a no-load input current measurement, disconnect the electronic load as the load can draw a small residual current.

**Oscilloscope:** With the scope set to 20MHz bandwidth and AC coupling, measure the output voltage ripple directly across an output capacitor with a short ground lead normally provided with the scope probe. Place the oscilloscope probe tip on the positive terminal of the output capacitor, holding the ground barrel of the probe through the ground lead to the negative terminal of the capacitor. TI does not recommend using a long-leaded ground connection because this can induce additional noise given a large ground loop. To measure other waveforms, adjust the oscilloscope as needed.

Safety: Always use caution when touching any circuits that can be live or energized.

### 2.1.3 Recommended Test Setup

#### 2.1.3.1 Input Connections

- 1. Prior to connecting the DC input source, set the current limit of the input supply to 0.1A maximum. Make sure the input source is initially set to 0V and connected to the VIN and GND connection points as shown in Figure 2-1.
- 2. Connect ammeter 2 to measure the input current and set to at least 1-second aperture time.

#### 2.1.3.2 Output connections

- 1. Connect electronic load to VOUT connection. Set the load to constant-resistance mode or constant-current mode at 0A before applying input voltage.
- 2. Connect voltmeter at VOUT and GND connections to measure the output voltage.
- 3. Connect ammeter 1 to measure the output current.

#### 2.1.4 Test Procedure

### 2.1.4.1 Line and Load Regulation, Efficiency

- 1. Set up the EVM as previously described.
- 2. Set the load to constant resistance or constant current mode and to sink 0A.
- 3. Increase input source from 0V to 12V.
- 4. Increase the current limit of the input supply to 300mA.
- 5. Using voltmeter to measure the output voltage, V<sub>OUT</sub>, vary the load current from 0A to 300mA; V<sub>OUT</sub> must remain within the load regulation specification.
- 6. Set the load current to 300mA and vary the input source voltage from 5.5V to 65V; V<sub>OUT</sub> must remain within the line regulation specification.
- 7. Decrease load to 0A. Decrease input source voltage to 0V.

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## 3 Implementation Results

## 3.1 Performance Data and Results




Figure 3-2. Efficiency, V<sub>OUT</sub> = 5V, 1100kHz(FPWM)

The typical performance curves for the LMR51603EVM are shown in Figure 3-1 through Figure 3-2. Due to the actual performance data that can be affected by measurement techniques and environmental variables, these curves are presented for reference and can differ from actual field measurements.






Figure 3-3. Start-Up Relative to EN,  $V_{IN}$  = 12V,  $I_{OUT}$  = 300mA




Figure 3-4. Start-Up Relative to VIN,  $V_{IN}$  = 12V,  $I_{OUT}$  = 300mA




Figure 3-5. Load Transient Response,  $V_{IN}$  = 12V, 0A to 300mA at 1.6A/ $\mu$ s




Figure 3-6. Load Transient Response,  $V_{\text{IN}}$  = 12V, 60mA to 240mA at 1.6A/ $\mu$ s




Figure 3-7. LMR51603EVM Output Voltage Ripple at No Load, PFM




Figure 3-8. LMR51603EVM Output Voltage Ripple, I<sub>OUT</sub> = 300mA




Figure 4-1. LMR51603EVM Schematic Diagram




Figure 4-2. Top Copper (Top View)




Figure 4-3. Layer 2 Copper (Top View)




Figure 4-4. Layer 3 Copper (Top View)




Figure 4-5. Bottom Copper (Top View)
