Description

The BQ25188EVM evaluation module (EVM) to evaluate the BQ25188 device. The EVM supports charge currents up to 1A and SYS currents up to 3A. The BQ25188EVM provides an external MR for device pushbutton functionality evaluation, a TS potentiometer circuit for TS functionality evaluation, and a USB2ANY port for I2C interfacing functionality. The EVM also includes a discrete LDO for digital pullup rails with jumpers for configurability.



1 Evaluation Module Overview

1.1 Introduction

The BQ25188EVM is an evaluation kit for the BQ25188 integrated battery charge management IC. The BQ25188 is an integrated battery charge management IC that integrates the most common functions for wearable devices: linear charger, regulated output, manual reset with timer, and ship mode function. The low quiescent current (IQ) during operation and shutdown enables maximum battery life.

This user's guide provides detailed testing instructions for the BQ25188 evaluation module (EVM). Also included are descriptions of the necessary equipment, equipment setup, procedures, the printed-circuit board layouts, schematics, and the bill of materials (BOM). Throughout this user's guide, the abbreviation *EVM*, *BQ25188EVM*, and the term evaluation module are synonymous with the BQ25188 evaluation module, unless otherwise noted.

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
2 Hardware

2.1 EVM Setup

The jumper connections and jumper description are listed in Table 2-1. The recommended operating conditions are listed in Table 1-1.

Note

Connecting the J7 jumper enables the VIO LED. This LED draws 10mA.

2.3 Testing Procedures

2.3.1 Equipment

This section includes a list of supplies required to perform tests on this EVM.


- 1. Two Power Supplies: Keithley 2400 power supply or equivalent.
 - a. Power Supply #1 (PS #1) is used as input voltage.
 - b. Power Supply #2 (PS #2) is used as battery voltage.
- 2. 4 Channel Oscilloscope: To monitor voltages at VIN, VBAT, and VSYS.
 - a. Channel 1 (SC #1) is used to probe VIN.
 - b. Channel 2 (SC #2) is used to probe VBAT.
 - c. Channel 3 (SC #3) is used to probe VSYS.
- 3. Computer: A computer with at least one USB port and a USB cable.
- 4. PC communication interface: USB2ANY with the latest firmware.
- 5. Software: Download the TI Charger GUI from ti.com.

2.3.2 Charge Mode

Connect the equipment as the following:

- Power Supply (PS#1): VIN of the BQ25188 at 5V
- Power Supply (PS#2): VBAT of the BQ25188 at 3.7V
- Scope Channel (SC#1): VIN
- Scope Channel (SC#2): VSYS
- Scope Channel (SC#3): VBAT

Turn the supply PS#2 on, then turn the supply PS#1 on. The VSYS rises to the level of 4.5V. The device begins to charge as long as the TS is left at default configuration and there are no other faults.



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


Figure 2-1. BQ25188 EVM Connections

To adjust the charge current or change other parameters, connect the USB2ANY to the EVM and then start up the TI Charger GUI.

Note

If the supplies (VIN and VBAT) are turned off, then users need to restart the TI Charger GUI for the correct I²C transactions to be reflected in the TI Charger GUI.




Figure 2-2. TI Charger GUI Device Selection

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Select the BQ2518X from the charger selection. Click Quick Start or Register Map.




Figure 2-3. BQ25188EVM Connected




Figure 2-4. Quick Start




Figure 2-5. Register Map

2.3.3 Ship Mode




Figure 2-6. SHIP_RST Register

To go to Ship Mode, enable ship mode through an I²C transaction to set EN_SHIP_RST bits or the PB_LPRESS_ACTION bits as shown in Figure 2-6:

- EN_RST_SHIP = 2b01 (enable Ship mode with wake on button press or adapter insert)
- PB_PRESS_ACTION = 2b10 (enable Ship mode)

Enter Ship mode by removing VIN if setting EN_RST_SHIP to 2b01. If setting PB_LPRESS_ACTION to 2b10 to enable Ship mode, then hold the TS/MR button for the configured t_{LPRESS} then remove VIN.

When the voltage on the SYS (SC#2) falls to 0V, Ship mode has been enabled.







Figure 3-2. BQ25188EVM Jumper Connectors






Figure 3-3. LDO for Other Peripherals




Figure 3-4. Top Layer




Figure 3-5. Bottom Layer
